

STANDARDISED PRICE LIST 2024



All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and to let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary).

ATTENDED FUNERAL (Funeral director charge;) covers shop overheads £1500

This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony or service at the same time as they attend the burial or cremation.

Breakdown of fee below:

Taking care of necessary legal and administrative arrangements Included

Collecting and transporting the deceased from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of the funeral director's premises) into the funeral director's care depending on circumstances/time of day from £150

Care of the deceased before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased will be kept at the funeral director's premises included

Coffin – of your choosing from £270

At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased direct to the agreed cemetery or crematorium (normally within 20 miles of the funeral director's premises) in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle estate car £50/hearse £200

OTHER FEES YOU MUST PAY

For an Attended burial, the **burial fee**.¹

In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee for local residents is: £1600-£1700

For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial in place, you will need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge additional fees.

For an Attended cremation, the **cremation fee**.²

In this local area, the typical cost of a cremation for local residents is York £1037

UNATTENDED FUNERAL/DIRECT CREMATION

This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony or service for the deceased, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.

Burial (funeral director charges only) Not Offered

Direct Cremation (funeral director charges and cremation combined)² (+ £82 for Dr's fee if necessary) £1680

ADDITIONAL FUNERAL DIRECTOR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES

The funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services, for example:

Additional mileage (per mile) £1

Additional transfers of the deceased (e.g. to their home, to a place of worship, etc.)

(price per transfer) £200

Collection and delivery of ashes to be collected by family

Embalming only if necessary

Funeral Officiant (celebrant, minister of religion, etc.) £200 - £350

Services supplied outside normal office hours prices on request

The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services, so **you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement, or you can use a different supplier.**

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or re-opening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay a doctor's fee as well. This is the charge for the Medical Certificate for Cremation.
